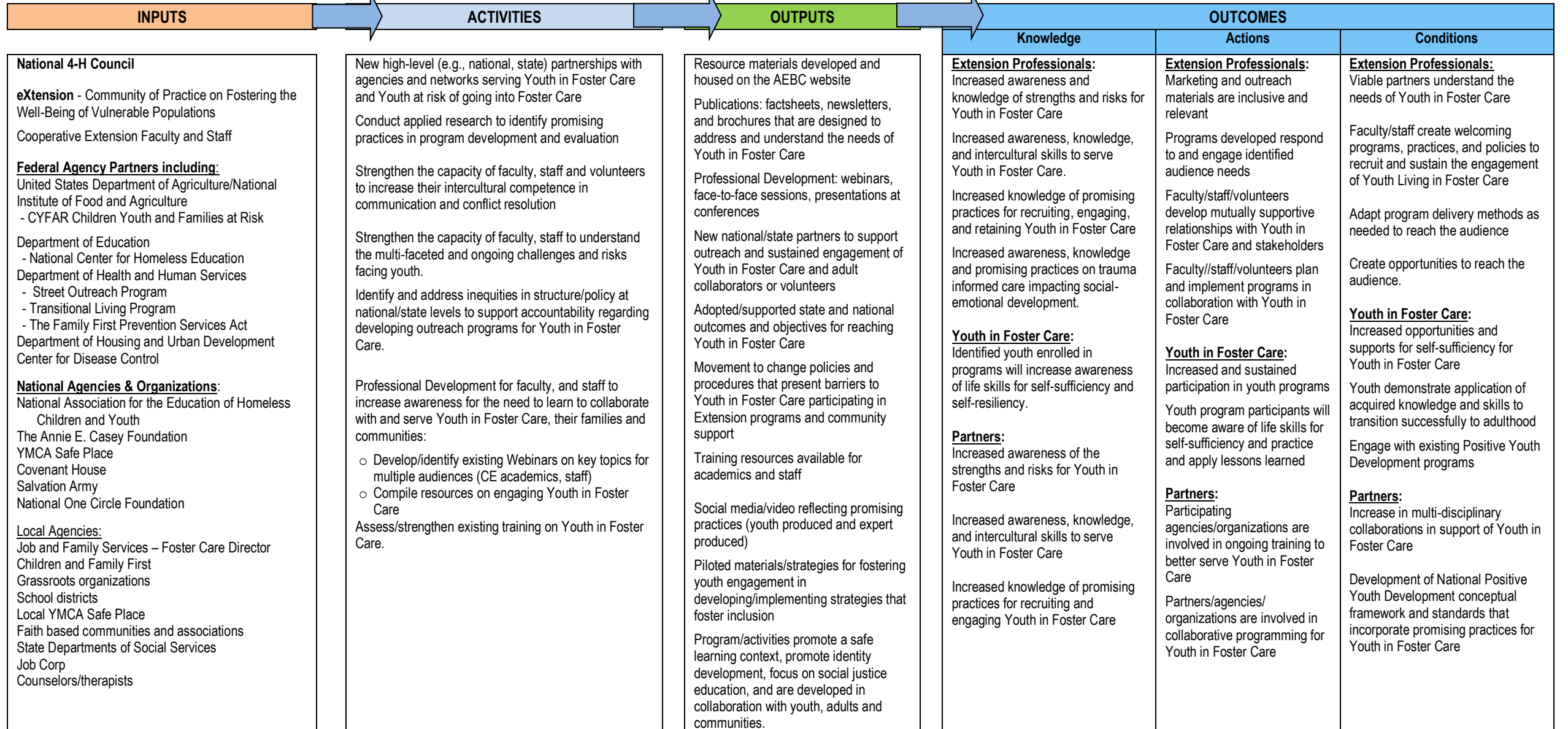


PLWG AEB Youth in Foster Care Champion Group Logic Model as of 9/24/2022

This initiative aims to increase the capacity of 4-H and Cooperative Extension to engage Youth currently living in Foster Care and Youth at risk of going into Foster Care.
